### Seeing the Dancing Eyes

I entered the main sanctuary of the Adas Israel, last Friday, for my first Minyan in many months. The majestic room glistened from the myriads of spotlights that illuminated the marble Ark and light mahogany pews. The room was dotted by white cards, carefully placed 2 metres apart, printed with black letters spelling the word "RESERVED".

I had already been processed by the screener at the door,

sanitized my hands, and was wearing my mask, with some discomfort. The room began to fill with others as well. I couldn't see their faces but could recognize them all. Above their masks, I could see familiar dancing eyes. These were the few that had returned, with caution, after a journey in the wilderness.

Coronavirus had effectively deconstructed much of our societal structure. It cast us onto islands and into bubbles, untethering us from the moorings of life that keep us in check. Like a leaf unshackled from its branch, we quickly found ourselves surrendering to the soft wind, floating effortlessly with the breeze.

With the announcement of the reopening of Houses of Worship, I realized, with unease and uncertainty, how my anchor was quickly returning. Sitting on the Bimah, over two meters away from the Chazzan, I recognized that structure is my connector. I found myself sitting in my father's chair, with my son by my side, gazing out at rows of pews, each one steeped with their own history. I was enveloped by the milestones that were once celebrated within the walls, by the tears shed for those who were no longer here. I was transfixed by the timeless, ancient, words of our past, and the echoes of the "Amen, Yehei Shmey Rabbah", that remained silenced for much too long.

Things may have appeared starkly different from what they were, but I welcomed back my context and, by extension, my identity. Unknowingly, my leaf yearned to return to the branch.

With easing restrictions, people have slowly begun to leave their islands and expand their bubbles. Slowly, some leaves are returning. The Torah refers to our tribes as both a



branch (Mateh) and a walking stick (Shevet). Walking sticks enable us to march forward with confidence but true lasting strength is determined by our connection to our life-source - the trunk and roots of our traditions.
