Parashat Vayikra

אבינו מלכנו מנע מגפה

Our Father in heaven, withhold the plague. (Siddur)

While the siddur adds the word, 'from your heritage' to the above Hebrew statement referring to the people of Israel, according to the Dover Shalom commentary, based on a verse found in I Chronicles 21:17, we must expand that prayer to encompass all people regardless of religion. It is in the spirit of that prayer that we see Israeli doctors in Italy fighting to save lives. It is in that spirit that we see innumerable health workers, professionals and volunteers endangering themselves as they valiantly perform their holy work against all odds. It is in that spirit of those people who shop for the isolated and the quarantined. It is in that spirit that we see the best of humanity come out.

These are the people who sacrifice themselves on the altar of good deeds in a figurative way. These are the people who understand that the term used in our Torah

reading this Shabbat, 'korban; is not simply an offering, but an act where these people bring themselves closer to G-d (karov, the root of korban) in reaching out to those who cannot help themselves.

Those who give of themselves to help the victims of coronavirus call out to G-d in their unique ways to guide them and to enable them to channel their energies in providing relief to those who are suffering from Covid-19. In the beginning of the Torah reading this Shabbat, Hashem calls out to Moshe. It is our turn to call out to Hashem.

On Wednesday, I participated in a Federation session with other communal leaders and rabbis to discuss the impact of the coronavirus on our community, Part of the meeting dealt with the topic of 'assessed needs', and the following were indicated which may be of help or interest to members of our shul and their contacts.

In terms of helping people in need in our congregation and elsewhere in Ottawa, the following were indicated as leads:

Hebrew Free Loan- Money is available through the good offices of Hebrew Free Loan. Jewish Family Services-JFS- gives out vouchers for food for those in need. It indicated it will also be providing Meals on Wheels Kosher for Pesach through Hillel Lodge. There is a Facebook group called 'Jewish Ottawa Helps' that has volunteers willing to do shopping,etc.

Ten Yad has indicated it is prepared to help families that have been diagnosed with the Coronavirus.

There is a recognized need to remain in constant contact with those who are in isolation. We are all going through a traumatic time. I am in the process of contacting our full membership as a sort of a spiritual check up phone call. This process will take some time. It is important for all of us to be in contact with one another.
