Reflections from Father Derek

Forming A Vision for the New Evangelization

With new leadership comes new vision. When many of you were children, the world was a much different place.

1. No cell phones. No internet. No Netflix.
2. No grocery stores, gas stations, or malls were open on Sundays.
3. If someone said that they didn't believe in God, you would've thought them from another planet or thought them high or drunk.

My experience was very different.

1. Cell phones and the internet revolutionized the flow and content of information, good and bad.
2. While church was important, it wasn't so important to close the grocery store or gas station! Soccer games and basketball practice were normal Sunday activities.
3. Today, 25% of our country (80 million people) claim to not have a religion. For those 18-29 years old, that number goes up to 40% (almost 130 million people).

To account for these differences, St. John Paul II coined the term "The New Evangelization" in a 1990 document called, *Redemptoris Missio (The Mission of the Redeemer)*. It was specifically directed to reaching out to those who have Catholic roots but have lost a living sense of the faith, or no longer even consider themselves members of the Church. Pope Benedict continued his predecessor's work saying, "The New Evangelization is new, not in its content but rather in its inner thrust; new in its methods that must correspond to the times; and new because it is necessary to proclaim the Gospel to those who have already heard it." And today, Pope Francis says, "Evangelization is first and foremost about preaching the Gospel to those who do not know Jesus."

Reflect on how your experience of your Catholic faith might be different than today and what is needed to reach out to a friend, family member, or someone who is hurting. Stay tuned for further articles discussing how we as a parish can serve in this New Evangelization.

Pondering Priesthood

A Seminarian's Thoughts

Following the deacon candidate promising respect and obedience to the bishop and his successors, the Litany of Saints is then sung. I wrote an article on this part of the ordination Mass for the summer/fall edition for *Words of Wisdom*, so I will not go into great detail here. During the Litany of Saints, the deacon candidates prostrate themselves, lying face down on the marble floor of the chapel/cathedral. This posture is rarely done in the liturgies of the Church. Outside of ordination or religious profession, the only other time prostration is done is on Good Friday at the start of the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion. The act of prostration is an external sign of total submission to God. As the candidate lies prostrate on the floor during the ordination, the congregation sings the Litany of Saints, invoking the saints of our tradition to assist the candidate with their prayers to God. This is a tangible expression of a fundamental pillar of our faith, "*I believe in the Communion of Saints.*"

Once the litany concludes, the candidate approaches the bishop individually for the laying on of hands. For an ordination to be valid, the laying on of hands and consecratory prayer led by a validly ordained bishop must occur. The Catholic Church has an unbroken line of succession through the laying on of hands dating back to the first apostles. The apostles laid hands on their successors, and the first deacons, as referenced in Acts 6. Throughout the centuries, bishops have laid hands on the heads of brother bishops, priests, and deacons, to continue to allow the salvific works of Christ to be made present here in our time and place. As the bishop lays his hands on each candidate's head, he prays in silence for the Holy Spirit to come upon the candidate, and guide him in his ministry to God's people.

After each candidate has approached the bishop individually for the laying on of hands, the bishop prays the consecratory prayer for ordination over all the candidates. The prayer is rather long, but beautifully simple in its wording and invocation of the Spirit to strengthen these men who are being ordained. One part that sticks out as I pray this prayer daily in preparation for ordination is:

"May he excel in every virtue: in love that is sincere, in concern for the sick and the poor, in unassuming authority, in self-discipline, and in holiness of life. May his conduct exemplify your commandments and lead your people to imitate his purity of life. May he remain strong and steadfast in Christ, giving to the world the witness of a pure conscience. May he in this life imitate your Son, who came, not to be served, but to serve, and one day reign with him in heaven."

This excerpt emphasizes the role of the deacon, a servant and witness of Christ for others. This life of holiness that we are all called to cannot be done alone. We need God, we need his grace, we need to encounter him in the sacraments. Through God's grace, we receive strength to continue on the path of wherever he is leading us, ultimately into his eternal embrace in heaven. Please pray for my classmates and me, as we are less than two weeks away from our ordination into the service of God's people.

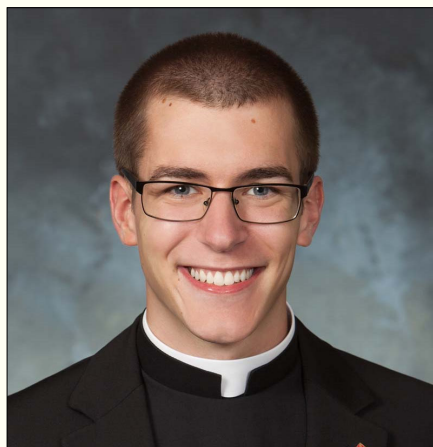

Our Parish School Highlights

A Message from the Principal

Dear Parish Family and Friends

I want to update you all on the work my team and I are doing to finalize plans for reopening the school for the 2020-21 school year on Tuesday, August 25. We are looking forward to having the school building open and seeing students and teachers who have been gone for far too long.

Teachers have been working on lesson plans and preparing for both in-school and eLearning possibilities. These times are particularly challenging for our teachers. Details are being shared with the school community as they are finalized or modified. I am so very grateful for the faculty's tireless and dedicated commitment to MSW and our students!

State and local updates have indicated that thus far Illinois has done well in its response to the virus, but our landscape continues to evolve. The Archdiocese of Chicago, following the guidelines developed by the Illinois State Board of Education, the Illinois Department of Public Health and the CDC, has developed a plan for reopening of all parish schools. Our Leadership Teams of faculty and staff are carefully considering and training for all measures that we must take to ensure everyone's health and safety as we reopen the school.

Our plans include:

- ◆ Masks will be worn by EVERYONE in the building
- ◆ Each person will have his/her temperature taken before entering the building
- ◆ Students will be assigned to grade-level "cohorts"
- ◆ All classes will meet in their homerooms; teachers will travel to classrooms for instruction
- ◆ Hygiene stations will be provided in each classroom
- ◆ All shared spaces and surfaces will be cleaned/sanitized several times during the day
- ◆ Cleaning standards will comply with CDC recommendations, including semi-weekly building fogging
- ◆ No sharing of any supplies (art class, etc.)
- ◆ Incorporating several recess periods into the daily schedule, particularly for younger students
- ◆ Cohort entry and exit points will be assigned to facilitate social distancing
- ◆ Staggered entry/dismissal schedules to minimize the opportunity to congregate on campus
- ◆ Extended Day Program will operate with children in small groups that rotate for activities
- ◆ No all-school activities (Masses or assemblies) will occur, but smaller groups may be able to attend Mass in conformance with Archdiocesan Mass attendance requirements

As we prepare for the new school year, mindful of the health and safety of each member of our school family, we will be prudent in our decision-making, enforce the most conservative approaches to school reentry, and certainly adhere to the guidelines set forth. The COVID situation is fluid and changes to our planning may be mandated.

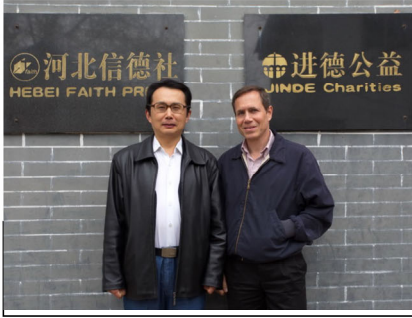
Our maintenance team has already been busily scrubbing, packing, moving furniture and installing new interactive screens in lower grade classrooms. The Cleaning Company will strip and wax hallway and classroom floors as well as deeply clean all building areas.

Meanwhile, I hope that you, as well as the entire school family, remain healthy and can enjoy these beautiful summer days.

US-China Catholic Association

Mission Appeal



Today in China there are some 12 million Catholics, according to official estimates, more according to other sources. The US-China Catholic Association exists to promote mutual understanding, friendship and exchange between Catholics in the United States and Catholics in China. Founded in 1989 with through the collaborative efforts of Maryknoll, the Jesuits, other religious orders, and the US bishops, today the China Association represents a cross-section of American Catholic organizations and individuals working in partnership with Catholics in China to advance the mission of the Church in our world today.



Currently, the Chinese government has launched a drive for all religions to limit outside influence and conform to Chinese ways of doing things. Priests operate throughout the country under the strict supervision of the Chinese authorities. These policies have exacerbated the tensions under which Catholics in China live their faith.

In this context, the USCCA provides the American public with balanced information concerning the circumstances of the Church in China through its website, its newsletter, various speaker series, and biennial national conferences. It runs study tours in China so that Americans can have firsthand experience of the reality of Chinese society and the Chinese Church. In collaboration with affiliate organizations, it is developing programs for lay ministerial training, translation of religious and devotional literature, and the provision of informational materials regarding Catholicism in China for Americans traveling there.

This year, in particular, we were able to promote networking between Catholic organizations in China and the U.S. in response to the Covid-19 pandemic.

At present we are engaged in a new effort, the Campus Ministry Outreach Initiative. Currently over 450,000 Chinese international students study at U.S. high schools and universities. In view of this reality, the China Association is working with partners to assist teachers, professors, counselors, and campus ministers better host and engage these young people to provide opportunities for deeper understanding, mutual exchange, and friendship, and ultimately, share the Gospel message to take back to China.

We trust that the seeds of faith and friendship that we plant will, with the nurture of the Holy Spirit, bear fruit in the lives of these young people. It is they will go on to make a difference in China and the world in the years ahead.

All our recent popes have emphasized the vital importance of the Church's mission in China. Saint Pope John Paul II constantly sought to strengthen the faithful in China. Pope Benedict XVI wrote a milestone pastoral letter to the Chinese Church to provide guidelines under difficult circumstances. Since his accession, Pope Francis has reached out to Chinese leaders in fraternal charity, recently concluding an agreement regarding the appointment of bishops in China.

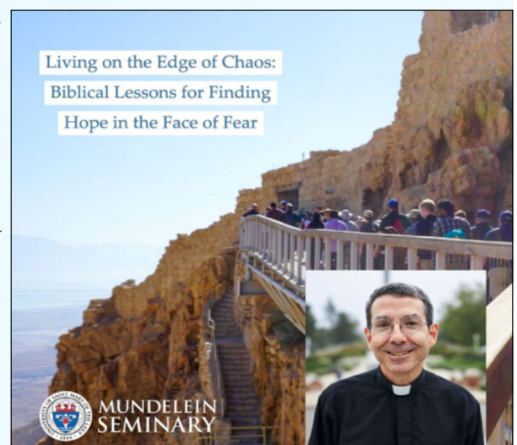
ONLINE BIBLE STUDY WITH MUNDELEIN SEMINARY

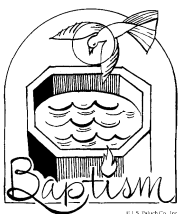


