Shabbat Shalom D'var Torah

As I reviewed this week's parshiyot, I found myself focusing on the first part of parashat Metzorah. Here we find the process of how a metzorah, a person who is inflicted with tzaraat, a spiritual disease, becomes purified again. This is a person who was punished in a very public way for mistakes that he made. The person was totally isolated for the duration of his disease. Isolation is something that we can all relate to now more than ever before and maybe the plight of the metzorah seems more real to us because of it.

Now, here in the parasha, we learn of a very specific process to reenter society once the metzorah has repented and his disease has cleared up as a result. It's a very (strange and) arduous process including being shaved, being sprinkled with bloody water, immersing in a mikveh more than once and bringing sacrifices to the Beit haMikdash. A person who submits to all of this shows that he is really making an effort to put his past behind him and to improve himself.

We are all human. We make mistakes. There are many funny videos and memes about the kinds of mistakes we make these days in these unusual times. We say "we are in this together" and "we are all doing our best" and I think that is true. These days of juggling jobs and learning from home and managing your family needs and social distancing are not easy by any means. I think it's great to have a sense of humor when managing them but I also hope that we can take some inspiration from the metzorah to identify the mistakes we are making along the way and work on improving on them as we go. Personally, I have a pretty good list going!


