Larry Grossman began in the New York musical theater scene in the early 1960's. His Broadway composition debut was in 1970 with the musicals: *Minnie's Boys, Goodtime Charley, A Doll's Life* and *Grind*. He also composed many animated film scores, including *Pocahontas II: Journey to a New World* and *The Princess Diaries 2*. Grossman is known, perhaps most famously, for having written the Michael Jackson song "Gone Too Soon." Grossman has been awarded six Emmys and many Tony nominations. Currently, Grossman is the music supervisor and composer for *Julie's Greenroom*, the Netflix original children's series starring Julie Andrews and The Muppets.



CBST Pro Se Immigration Clinic – Our First Year!

In partnership with SAFE (Seeking Asylum and Finding Empowerment), RUSA LGBT, and the New Sanctuary Coalition, our first Clinic meeting was on May 8, 2019. We've met almost every Wednesday since then, including since moving our work entirely online in mid-March.





We've taught 3 Introduction to Asylum Law CLE courses, the first synagogue to offer accredited Continuing Legal Education (CLE), training over 100 lawyers. We've held multiple volunteer trainings, with over 200 non-lawyer volunteers. We've raised over \$30,000 through our Bond Fund, 100% of which goes to help free our immigrant friends from detention.

145 immigrant friends have come into our community from 32 countries, about 75% of whom are LGBTQ+ and/or HIV+. We've worked with them in 7 languages, connected 25% of them to legal representation, and so far 8 of them have won their asylum cases. One of these, Kimane Williams, is now a volunteer with the clinic, and was our guest speaker for National Refugee Shabbat.

And now, we are providing emergency support to our friends thanks to Rabbi Kleinbaum's discretionary fund, with a network of dedicated clinic volunteers reaching out to connect with every one of our immigrant friends.
