

#### For the Strength of Youth Conferences (Updated April 13)

2020 FSY Conferences in the U.S. and Canada Postponed Until 2021

Due to the ongoing impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, For the Strength of Youth (FSY) conferences scheduled to be held in the U.S. and Canada in 2020 have been postponed until 2021. Stakes invited to attend FSY conferences in 2020 will now attend in 2021. An updated schedule of FSY conferences to be held in the U.S. and Canada in 2021–23 can be found here.

All participant payments for FSY registration fees will be automatically refunded on or before April 30, 2020. The refund will be processed on the card used for payment of the fees when registering. If the card used at registration is no longer valid, the participant will receive a refund check mailed to the address associated with their registration. Some credit card processors may take up to 14 days after the refund is processed to post the refund to the card account.

Outside of the U.S. and Canada, Area Presidencies will provide guidance on whether FSY conferences will be held. These decisions will be made in accordance with COVID-19 guidelines established by governments in their communities and countries. All leaders should continue to abide by the direction given March 12, 2020, by the First Presidency and Quorum of the Twelve Apostles—namely, that all public gatherings of Church members, including branch, ward, and stake activities, are temporarily suspended worldwide.

# General Conference (Updated March 19)

In a letter March 19 to Latter-day Saints around the globe, the First Presidency and Quorum of the Twelve Apostles announced additional updates to the April 2020 general conference. Each session will be broadcast from a small auditorium on Temple Square. The First Presidency will preside and conduct those sessions, and only those who have been invited to speak or pray will attend. The music for the conference has been pre-recorded. ## Missionary Work (Updated April 1)

Missionaries are in the process of returning to their home nations. This applies to all areas except Europe and Europe East. In addition, U.S. citizens serving in Canada will remain in Canada, and Canadians serving in the U.S. will remain in the U.S.

In a letter sent March 31, 2020, the First Presidency and Quorum of the Twelve Apostles outlined temporary adjustments to missionary service. New service options are available for current and prospective missionaries. See the letter and an accompanying table of adjustments.

As of March 30, 2020, two missionaries are known to have contracted COVID-19. Moving forward, the Church will rely on public health agencies and individuals to make these notifications.

Each missionary who returns home is asked to self-isolate for 14 days following instructions from the World Health Organization and the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

#### Preventative Measures for Members

For all Church members, there is wisdom in taking steps to remain healthy during this cold and flu season. These precautions include\*:

 Regularly and thoroughly wash your hands with soap and water or clean them with an alcoholbased hand rub

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick (this may include avoiding shaking hands or other customary greetings).
- · Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- · Stay home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Maintain at least six feet (two meters) distance between yourself and anyone who is coughing or sneezing.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- · Follow public health agency recommendations for using a face mask.

Church leaders also sent a letter to Saints on March 12 that says worship services worldwide are temporarily suspended. Local leaders will counsel to determine how to make the sacrament available to members at least once a month.

# Temple Square (Updated March 14)

All public areas of the following Church-owned buildings in and around Temple Square closed, effective 5:00 p.m. MDT on Friday March 13. The closures will remain in effect until further notice.

- Tabernacle
- · North Visitors' Center
- Family History Library
- · Church History Museum
- · Relief Society Building
- · Church Office Building
- Beehive House

The construction work on the Salt Lake Temple will continue as planned. At Welfare Square, operations will remain open, but public tours are temporarily discontinued going forward.

# Temple Worship (Updated March 25)

In a letter issued March 25, 2020, the First Presidency announced it will temporarily close all temples. Temple staff will contact all patrons with an existing appointment to confirm cancellation. When temples resume activity, patrons should contact the temple to reschedule their living ordinances. Members with additional questions are invited to visit with their bishop or stake president.

# Deseret Industries

Deseret Industries stores are adjusting their services to support community health. Beginning Wednesday, March 18, stores will be closed to the general public for shopping and donations but will remain open to support the needs of individuals served by bishops' orders and community partner grants. Stores will be open Tuesday, March 17, until 6:00 p.m. MDT.

Employees of Deseret Industries who are in low-risk demographics may be transferred to support the work of bishops' storehouses and food processing operations to backfill any staff or volunteers from those facilities who are in a higher risk category and, out of an abundance of caution, remain at home. These closures and transfers are temporary. Updated information will be provided as this situation evolves.
