Shabbat Shalom D'var Torah

The history of the Jewish people over the last 2,000 years has been defined by not having the benefit of living in unification in one land, with a common language and strong numbers. Instead, we have been dispersed throughout the world, and forced to rise above the challenges presented to us in our host countries. We have always prevailed. We have been able to accomplish what no other nation in the history of the world has been able to do. We are one of the oldest nations in the world and the only to survive despite the difficult challenges and hurdles thrown our way.

The burning question is, what has been the secret of our survival? How is it possible that we have prevailed in the face of all the trials and tribulations we faced as a nation. How were we able to remain a cohesive nation with more people learning Torah today since the destruction of the Bais Hamikdash while separated and spread throughout the world? I want to give a shout out to all our parents for having a growth mindset and creating magical moments for our children. You are doing a great job instilling our Jewish values in our children.

I am confident the CTA community is going to thrive and only get stronger through this challenge. We might be physically separated but our shared values, convictions and kindness will propel us to be an even closer community. Our commitment to learning and taking care of one another will only make us an even stronger school community. G-d willing, everyone should stay healthy. We got this! Go Lions!
