"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and the God of all consolation, who consoles us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to console those who are in any affliction with the consolation with which we ourselves are consoled by God."

2 Corinthians 1:3-4

There is an apocryphal quote often attributed to the Chinese, "may you live in interesting times." This quote is viewed both as a blessing and a curse, connoting that life is full of challenges, threats, dangers, and discomforts, and that peace, harmony, quiet, and calm are illusions. We are living in "interesting times" right now, but we do not need to worry or fear – God is with us!
